Demonstrate the ability to attend to and understand communication from others. L.RC

- 1 Use verbal and nonverbal signals to acknowledge communication from others.** L.RC.PK1

- 2 Show ongoing connection to a conversation, group discussion, or presentation.** L.RC.PK2

- 3 Recall and follow two- and three-step directions.** L.RC.PK3

- 4 Show understanding of books read aloud, stories, or explanations on a topic.** L.RC.PK4

- 5 Listen with increasing attention span to gain new knowledge.** L.RC.PK5

Demonstrate the ability to express themselves verbally or nonverbally. L.EC

- 1 Communicate to express self in detailed ways.** L.EC.PK1

- 2 Communicate in complete sentences using at least three words.** L.EC.PK2

- 3 Follow conventions of conversation most of the time.** L.EC.PK3

- 4 Share ideas and information from personal and group experiences.** L.EC.PK4

- 5 Communicate to express needs and clarify a word or statement when misunderstood.** L.EC.PK5

Use a variety of vocabulary words during play and other activities. L.V

- 1 Use vocabulary words with increasing specificity and variety to describe feelings, experiences, observations, and ideas.** L.V.PK1

- 2 Use context to determine the meaning of unknown words.** L.V.PK2

- 3 Use a wide variety of words for many purposes.** L.V.PK3

Demonstrate knowledge of the alphabet and how letters are used in the reading process. L.AK

- 1 Identify the names of letters in own name and produce the sound of the first letter in own name.** L.AK.PK1
- 2 Identify and name most letters in their uppercase form and some letters in their lowercase form.** L.AK.PK2
- 3 Name and produce the letter sound for several letters.** L.AK.PK3

Demonstrate knowledge of how print and books are read. L.PB

- 1 Recognize that print carries a message and information.** L.PB.PK1
- 2 Recognize environmental print and symbols.** L.PB.PK2
- 3 Indicate that groups of letters form a word.** L.PB.PK3
- 4 Identify book parts and features, such as the front, back, title, and/or author.** L.PB.PK4

Demonstrate knowledge gained from stories, books, and other early literacy activities. L.C

- 1 Ask questions or make comments related to the details of a story.** L.C.PK1
- 2 Retell a story, putting at least two events in the appropriate sequence.** L.C.PK2
- 3 Predict what might happen next in a story.** L.C.PK3
- 4 Recall information and answer questions related to an event, text, or pictures related to self and the world around them.** L.C.PK4
- 5 Use pictures to gain meaning and follow a simple pictorial direction.** L.C.PK5

Demonstrate the use of written letters and symbols to communicate. L.W

- 1 Draw to express ideas, thoughts, or interests.** L.W.PK1
- 2 Experiment with writing tools and materials for variety of purposes.** L.W.PK2
- 3 Recreate basic shapes that form letters or draw the shapes while looking at a model.** L.W.PK3
- 4 Write for a variety of purposes using increasingly sophisticated marks.** L.W.PK4
- 5 Use letter-like approximation to print name.** L.W.PK5
- 6 Share ideas, information from experiences, and opinions for class writing.** L.W.PK6
